On the course, the Captain's Committee continues to monitor the pace of play, with fine results. The Pro Shop and the course Marshal are pleased with our performance.

In terms of our competition schedule, the Ed Angel, Putting Jamboree and our first of two Interclub games with MWMC were held in June. West Point Golf Club currently holds a 10 vs 4 lead in the Interclub, with the second match to be held at the end of August. In July the Club & Flight Championships were held. *Congratulations to Wayne Ferrey, our Club Champion for 2008.* As well, our second Away Game was held at King's Links. At this printing of the Divot Dust, we have just completed the second TNT Competition and are in the midst of competing for the four (4) stroke play Championships and the Parker Shield Eclectic. While we have made progress in developing a process for the Weekly Sign Up for the draw for the following week, we have more work to do. With the additional workload placed on the Captain's Committee as a result of increased membership play, we need to streamline our processes to reduce the workload. Still on the schedule for August are the third Away Game at Golden Eagle Golf Club and the Palcutta Tournament, one of our highlights of the golfing season. *The Palcutta Social Night is on Tuesday August 26<sup>th</sup> at Langara, followed by the Tournament on Friday, August 29<sup>th</sup>.* Make sure you all sign up early for this event. ### New Weekly Sign-Up Procedure

The new procedure *requires* Foursome Captains to indicate, on the weekly sign-up sheets, the status of play for their group *for the following two weeks*. The sign-up sheets will be on the Captain's table.

Your intention to play (and thus receive a tee time) must now be made known two weeks in advance. Note that you must inform the Captain of your regular foursome, so that he can sign you up - keep in mind that you may not have been playing with your regular foursome that day. If you plan to play and you have not been in contact with your regular Foursome Captain – check in at the Captain's table yourself.

Your playing status can be modified each week should circumstances change.

**REMEMBER - NO GIMMIES**

### **From Ed Angel (1991), *West Point Golf Club 1932 -1990 – A History.***

The first Inter Club match was played in 1989, at the University Club, which was handily won by the West Point Club. Apparently, Norm Clark donated a perpetual trophy for this event – *our historian will have to check this out!(Editor)*

The Hole in One Award was established in 1989 for any member ... *“who achieves a Hole in One while playing a complete round of 18 holes on the McCleery Golf Course, with no temporary greens or tees, when accompanied by two or more Club members, on any Monday to Friday from Opening Day to Closing Day.”*

*The Palcutta Smoker and Tournament* was introduced in 1986 and had become increasingly popular over the years. In 1989, “Twenty three teams vied for part of an Auction Pool of \$575.00, a Player Pool of \$230.00 and a Honey Pot of \$86.00. The *Dave Fairweather* team of *Jack Apps* and *Ed Bobinski* won top honours in the Auction Pool and Player Pool. The Honey Pot was shared by *Doug Symonds* and *Doug Whittle.*”



*Editor's Note – Dave is our Club's Rules Commentator as well as our advisor on rules interpretation and "brush-up" reminders.*

### A RULES REMINDER

A couple of weeks ago, a member posed a question and I wasn't able to provide a complete answer, so I checked out the Rules of Golf.



Question: If your ball comes to rest against a rake (movable obstruction), which has been placed on the grass slope beside a bunker, but in removing the rake, the ball moves, and will not stay at rest when a replacement is attempted, how is this dealt with?



*Under Movable Obstructions, Rule 24 1/4 and 1/5, it states in 24 1/4 that: "There is no penalty if a ball moves during removal of a movable obstruction", then in 24 1/5: "Before moving the obstruction, the player marks the position of the ball, so that he will be able to replace the ball precisely".*

The second part of the question is dealt with in Rule 20-3d/2. It speaks to a ball resting against a rake in a bunker and indicates that – "with the removal of the rake, the ball will not stay at rest on the original position, it must be placed at the nearest spot, not nearer the hole, where it can be placed at rest".

Logically, this would apply similarly to the ball at rest against a rake on a grass slope beside a bunker and when removed, the ball runs down into the bunker.

*Did you catch some of the British Open at Royal Birkdale –IN THAT WIND?*

After witnessing some of the coverage, particularly during the periods of high winds when balls occasionally were moving on the greens after being initially at rest, I, among others had a concern about *Rule 18-2b - Ball Moving After Address* and dropped a note to Brent McLaughlin, at the RCGA, to see if it is under review. In part, I said:

"The Forward in the 'good book', states - "The Rules of Golf should be faithful to their historical principles; must also be clear, comprehensive and understandable with penalties that are appropriate".

The question I have is this: "How can it be considered to be fair and appropriate when a player on the putting green under strong wind conditions will be subject to a penalty of one stroke if the wind moves the ball after he has taken his stance and grounded his club, before he can commence his stroke?"

I wonder if any action to review this Rule 18-2b is being considered. Many of us believe

that in the circumstances indicated, this Rule is contrary to the spirit and intent of fair play and that it deserves a good look.

I would appreciate your reaction and advice. Best Regards, Dave .

For the reader's information:

Rule 18-2b – Ball Moving After Address. "If a player's ball in play moves after he has addressed it (other than as a result of a stroke), the player is deemed to have moved the ball and incurs a penalty of one stroke. The ball must be replaced".

Addressing the ball: "A player has addressed the ball when he has taken his stance and has also grounded his club.

(Under strong wind conditions, he is under threat of a penalty if his ball is moved by the wind, after grounding his club but before starting his stroke).

Ball in Play Moved by Wind or Gravity:

A player has cleaned and placed his ball at rest on the putting green. Without addressing the ball, the player steps away to read his putt and the ball moves either due to the wind or slope of the green. The ball must be played from the new position without penalty. If it rolls into the hole, the player is deemed to have holed out with his previous stroke!!

A player has addressed his ball on the green, but then steps back to check the line and the ball moves before it is struck. The player incurs a penalty of one stroke and the ball must be replaced. By definition, the wind is not an outside agency.
