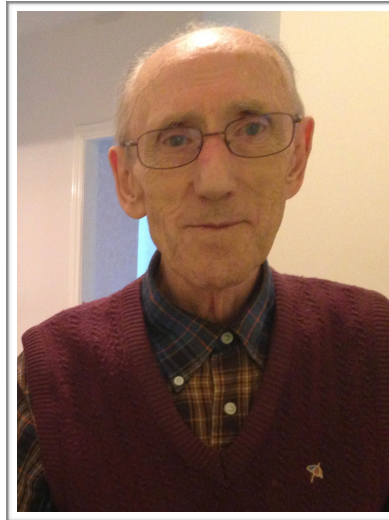


# Roy Moulton

*17 June, 1928 — 7 December, 2019*



Roy Moulton was born June 17, 1928 to Harold Moulton and Ethel Deakin in Stoke-on-Trent, Staffordshire, England. The eldest of his siblings, Roy immigrated to Canada in 1957, settling in Montreal, Quebec. Establishing himself in his new country, Roy opened an automotive shop, Transcontinental Motors, where his acumen brought business success.

His arrival in Montreal was a defining moment in his personal life, as it was there that he met the inimitable Patricia Kelly. She would become his wife and they enjoyed a long and happy marriage of fifty years. In the late 1960's, Roy and Pat fulfilled a dream by taking up residency in Auckland, New Zealand. They enjoyed their southern hemisphere hiatus from the Canadian winters, but ultimately felt the pull to return to Canada. Their long return sea voyage ended on Canada's Pacific coast in the port of Vancouver. They fell in love with the city by the sea and settled on Vancouver's west side.

Roy was a life-long learner and a gracious volunteer. He was recognized for his community service by the Vancouver Police Department. He was active in his condominium community and served as the President of his Strata Council. He was an avid and excellent golfer, winning numerous tournaments, and served as President of West Point Golf Club. Roy was so highly regarded that he is still their only lifetime honorary member.

Patricia preceded Roy in death on December 1, 2016 but their life together was rich with love and adventure. Roy died peacefully in his sleep on December 7, 2019. He is survived in Canada by his niece, Andrea Law (John Hough), his great-nephew Andrew Moulton, and his siblings in England, Ethel, Joyce, Alan, and Stanley.
