Playing with the West Point Golf Club

Protocol:

Members are required to play a minimum of 10 scheduled WPGC Thursday games and are encouraged to participate regularly in Club social and special events. All sign up for golf is now done through [eSignup](#).

The Park Board has advised that golfers cancelling without giving at least 2 hour notice or who have declared that they will be playing and do not turn up may be penalized.

Members are expected to adhere to the etiquette of golf. They will:

- Keep a good pace of play and keep up with the group in front. (See pace of play)
- Take care of the golf course.
- Play by the rules of golf, including local **WPGC** rules.
- Conduct themselves in a sportsmanlike manner.
- Maintain an accurate and up-to-date handicap.
- Act courteously and respectfully at all times in dealing with other members, golf course personnel, and concession staff.

HANDICAP REQUIREMENTS:

A member of the Captain's table will enter scores for Thursdays, Tuesdays at Riverway and Away Games. Members are responsible for entering their adjusted gross scores for all games played outside of West Point events including those played outside of Canada in the winter.

Failure to post your **adjusted gross scores** may result in the Captain's committee adjusting your handicap and/or excluding you from future competitions.

Handicaps are used for most of our competitions. Prizes such as the Weekly Winners are awarded based on handicaps. Handicaps are updated weekly just prior to the Thursday competition unless there is a multiple week event. With the new handicap system, Net Double Bogeys will replace ESC, Equitable Stroke Control.

Rules of Golf

We play by the Rules of Golf with the exception of our own Local Rules:

1. **Preferred Lie:** Through the green (except bunkers and penalty areas) the ball may be lifted, cleaned and placed not more than 6 inches from its original lie and no nearer the hole. The ball may not be moved without a One Stroke Penalty, when it lies within 1 club length of out of bounds, or a non-staked tree or a stump.

2. **Ball lost or out of bounds:** If a player does not hit a provisional ball and subsequently discovers that his ball is out of bounds or lost, the player may create a drop area by making an arc that extends from where his ball is thought to be lost to a point two club lengths onto the fairway no closer to the hole. This can be a rather large drop area. This will require a two-stroke penalty. For a better explanation see page 9 or go to the [USGA](#).

3. Looking for a Lost Ball

Our local time limit as well as the RCGA's time limit is three minutes.

4. Maximum Score if You Wish to Pick Up and Not Finish a Hole

You may pick up and not finish a hole without being disqualified. To do so you will enter a score equal to double par plus 1:

Par 3	Par 4	Par 5
7	9	11

5. **McCleery 11th hole:** If a member's first drive from the white tee does not clear the pond, he is entitled to take a 1 stroke penalty and hit his 3rd shot from the red tee area (not teeing up).

6. **Cart Path Only:** When the golf course has declared play to be cart path only, players using motorized carts are strongly encouraged to drop and play a ball from the cart path side of the fairway or rough in a similar position to where their ball has landed, not closer to the hole, without penalty.

7. All Putts Must Be Holed

This applies to all our fixtures except when we play match play. Then a putt may be conceded by your opponent.

8. Bunker Local Rule

Premise: Bunkers are to be maintained by the golf course and raked after use by the players hitting out of them. If this does not happen then...

Dry fair-weather conditions: If your ball lands in a bunker that hasn't been properly maintained or raked, you are entitled to lift your ball, rake the area, then replace your ball on the same spot. You should ask a member of your foursome to confirm that the conditions warrant using this rule.

Wet weather-rainy conditions: If your ball is in standing water, you may move your ball to another position in the bunker if possible, no closer to the hole. If the bunker is full of water, drop outside the bunker, no closer to the hole, no penalty. If the sand is packed or muddy, you may lift your ball, rake the area where it lay, then replace your ball. You should ask a member of your foursome to confirm that the conditions warrant using this rule.

eSignup

Our general policy is that a player's tee time will vary from week to week. That is from early morning, or mid-morning, or late morning. Tee time preferences cannot be guaranteed. When we have a full field of 80 players, it takes just about three hours to get all foursomes onto the golf course. Preferences and requests for tee times will be met when possible, especially when the need involves a doctor's appointment or a family matter.

eSignup is open for registration for Thursday Events until 5:00PM on the Friday prior to the event. Riverway and Away Game are open for signup six days prior to the event. Most events are available for sign up weeks ahead of the scheduled date of play.

If you miss the six-day cut off either to register or cancel, you must contact Vice Captain – Draw Ian Allan and the event coordinator by email.

If the event is a partnership or team event of more than one round and you cannot participate in the complete event you must notify both Ian and the event coordinator prior to the first day of the event.

Requirements for the Captain's Table

1. Every foursome must appoint a Captain/Score Keeper for the day
2. Players last names must be on the card
3. Each player should have the tee box he used indicated by a capital letter in front of his name. That is, W for white, R for red, B for blue.

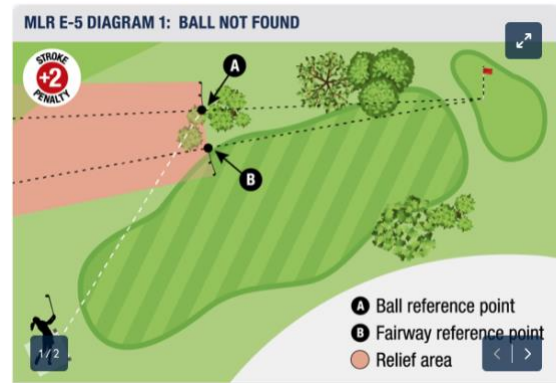
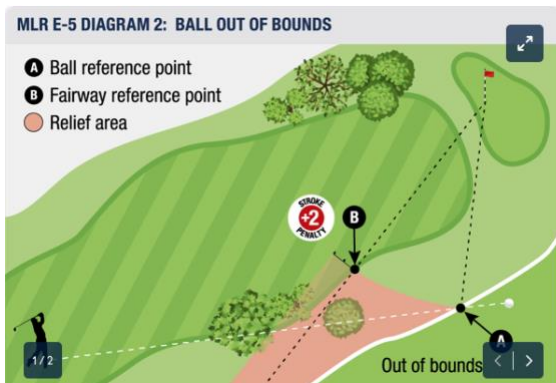

4. The Captain/Score Keeper will record all players' GROSS scores for each hole - the computer will calculate net scores.
5. The score card must show totals for the front 9, back 9 and grand total.
6. The scorecards must be punched in the time clock after all players have completed the 18th hole - this is required to record Pace of Play.
7. The Captain/Score Keeper will punch the time clock after all players in his foursome have completed their rounds.
8. The Captain/Score Keeper must confirm with each player in his foursome, at the end of play, that his score is correctly shown on the card. The Captain's Table will only accept one card per foursome.
9. The Captain/Score Keeper will read the scores to the Captain's Table.

Pace of Play

- Ensure your foursome maintains a satisfactory PACE OF PLAY by keeping up with the group IN FRONT of you. Additionally: *Play ready golf.
- Play a provisional ball if your shot is in doubt or use our Local Rule and take a two-stroke penalty in the area where you lost your ball. Note the relief area extends 2 club lengths onto the fairway.



- Time limit looking for a lost ball is **2 minutes**.
- If possible, putt continuously, don't mark short putts.
- Keep your cart/bag on the green side closest to the next hole.
- The first 2 players who have putt out go to the next tee and tee off.
- All players should maintain a courteous and cordial relationship with the Parks Boards staff and on-course marshals especially if they are being reminded of their pace of play.

*Ready Golf

- Means playing when you are ready, not necessarily when you are the farthest player from the hole.
- Playing ready golf means being deliberate, moving towards your ball, being considerate of your partners and playing safely. The new 2019 Rules of Golf states: "It is recommended that you make the stroke in no more than 40 seconds...and you should be able to play more quickly than that and are encouraged to do so."

In the first part Members earn participation points for Thursday rounds played with the club during the 2020 season:

Format: ALL PLAYERS PLAY FROM THE RED TEES

- The golf software will create 4-man teams with team total handicaps as equal as possible.
- After teeing off on each hole, one person is chosen to play his own ball for the entire hole, playing his own ball on that hole until he putts out.
- The remaining 3 players choose one of their drives and continue as a 3-man scramble, playing from the best next ball position until the ball is holed.
- Each player must play a minimum of 4 holes on their own.
- The player playing his own ball records his NET SCORE.
- The shamble players record the GROSS SCORE for the hole.
- The TEAM SCORE for the round is the sum of the individual net scores and the shamble/scramble scores for each hole.

Ties: Best back 9, best back 6, best back 3 etc.

Tee Location: All players must play from the **Red tees**.

Winner: The best Team Score.

Three Rounds at McCleery

April 2, 9, and 16

Format: Eclectic, best Net score and Gross score for each of the 18 holes from the number of rounds played on the above noted dates. The field will be divided evenly into three handicap Flights. After the first round, the leaders of each Flight will be grouped together by the Vice-Captain-Draw.

Tee Location: Gross stroke play must be from the white tees. For Net scores the use of all locations is allowable. Once a tee location is chosen, it must be used for all 3 rounds.

Scoring: The Net scores for all three rounds and the gross scores for those playing the white tees will be recorded on a master sheet which will be posted on the Club website. Scorecards will be turned into the Captain's Table.

Ties: Ties will be broken by using the lowest score on the #1 handicap hole followed by the #2 handicap hole etc.

Two Man Team Challenge

April 23rd

Coordinator: Richard Martin

Format: Teams chosen by our Vice Captain - Draw using our software to randomly select teams with balanced handicaps.

Front 9: Best ball with normal handicaps.

Back 9: Two man modified scramble.

For the front 9: Each golfer plays his own ball. The team score for a given hole is the lower net score of the two partners. Please put the gross scores on for each player on the scorecard.

For the back 9: Both players hit tee shots on all holes. One ball position is selected and each player plays a ball from that spot. This is repeated until the ball is holed. The team is required to use minimum of 4 drives/tees shots per player.

The team handicap will be computed by using the higher handicap player's handicap on the even number holes: 10, 12, 14, 16 and 18 and using the lower handicap player's on the odd number holes: 11, 13, 15 and 17. This will be computed at the Captain's Table.

Tee Location: Use of all locations is allowable. Once a tee location is chosen, it must be used for all holes.
